NEW UNAFFILIATED PRACTITIONER PERMIT APPLICATION CHECK-LIST

This check-list is provided to assist you in completing and/or submitting each document required to schedule an unaffiliated practitioner inspection and to receive a new permit number. Each required document must be received and approved prior to a permit number being issued.

Once your application and fee are received, the Inspector responsible for the geographic region where your records will be maintained will contact you. He or she will be your contact person throughout the application process.

- 1) All spaces on application filled out completely (including ownership structure, etc.)

- 2) **Non-refundable** application fee of \$250.00

- 3) Articles of Incorporation/Organization; Partnership Agreement; etc.
- 4) Assumed Business Name Certificate (if applicable – filed with local register of deeds)
- 5) Secretary of State (verification corporation or LLC is “current & active”)
- 6) Documents required by 16 C.F.R. § 453 / “Funeral Rule” (GPL, CPL, OBCPL, SFGSS)
- 7) Certificate of professional liability insurance demonstrating coverage in an amount not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00).
- 8) For **refrigeration** required by G.S. § 90-210.27A(l), a copy of the written agreement set forth under the provisions of 21 NCAC 34B .0707(d). A sample agreement can be obtained from your inspector.

Note: Once your application and fee have been submitted, please allow up to two (2) weeks for an inspection to be conducted.

Each required item must be received by the inspector prior to a permit number being issued.

The application process must be completed and a permit number issued within 90 days from the application date. Any application failing to be issued a permit number within 90 days will be considered denied.

This form must be signed by a Board inspector and returned with the inspection report.
