OUR NEW HOME — OPEN HOUSE

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The public comment period for proposed changes to 21 NCAC 34A .0100 General Provisions and 21 NCAC 34C Crematories began on February 17 and will end on April 17. The Board held a public hearing as required on March 17, 2004. Other than Board staff, no one made any comments during that hearing. The Board accepted and adopted the recommendations from the Crematory Authority to modify the letter designations of the BFS-56 series forms to more accurately reflect the chronology of tracking the remains through the cremation process. The Board set the date of January 1, 2005 as the mandatory compliance date to allow use of forms already printed by licensees. In addition the Board adopted the Crematory Authority recommendation to add wording to paragraph 11 of the required information for cremation authorization. The corrected forms are on the website. The added language is in bold italics and that paragraph now reads:

11. The Authorizing Agent(s) understand(s) that after this cremation authorization form is executed, the authorizing agent(s) can only revoke the authorization and instruct the crematory licensee or funeral establishment to cancel the cremation and to release or deliver the human remains to another crematory licensee or funeral establishment by providing such instructions to the crematory licensee in writing prior to the commencement of the cremation. The crematory licensee shall honor these instructions provided that it receives such instructions prior to commencement of the cremation of the human remains.

By executing this Cremation Authorization Form, as Authorizing Agent(s), the undersigned warrant that all representations and statements, except for Paragraph 5c ***if that information is unknown to the Authorizing Agent(s), contained on this form are true and correct, that these statements were made to induce the Crematory to cremate the human remains of the Decedent, and that the undersigned have read and understand the provisions contained on this form.***

There are proposed changes to other rules: pre-need, continuing education and traineeship. You can follow this process in the email newsletter and under the current events link on the website. Please check these areas for updates on the rules approval process.

THIS MONTH'S HIGHLIGHTS

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NEW FEES EFFECTIVE MARCH 1, 2004

On Thursday, February 19, 2004, the North Carolina Rules Review Commission approved the proposed changes to 21 NCAC 34A .0200 fees and other payments. These changes became permanent on March 1, 2004. The immediate effect will be in the pre-need contract registration fee which is now \$ 20.00 and the fee per cremation which is now \$10.00. The other fee increases will effect new license applications in 2004 and renewals in 2005.

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FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR....

The North Carolina Board of Funeral Service has experienced a lot of changes in the past six months: a name change, a new office and a new Executive Director. As a licensed funeral professional, I bring over twenty years of continuous experience to this position. I've been in the shoes of licensees dealing with the day to day issues facing funeral professionals today. I also know what is expected in terms of compliance with the laws governing funeral practice in North Carolina.

Many licensees see the board as an adversary rather than as a resource. I plan to work for a change in that viewpoint. Have you ever considered using the board in a positive way for your clients? Do you explain that all the regulations and forms are in place to reassure the families you are serving they are well protected? Perhaps you can turn a perceived negative into something positive for your clients to feel good about.

My hope is to continue to improve Board functions and the relationship with our licensees while making sure the funeral consumers of this state remain well protected.

NON – COMPLIANCE WITH FTC AND PRE-NEED

Even twenty years following the inception of the FTC Funeral Rule, we still have licensees without General Price Lists, Casket Price Lists and Outer Burial Container Price lists. The inspectors are reporting several instances of non-compliance with FTC rules.

Proper pre-need procedures is the other area of concern. The inspectors report many licensees' failure to maintain proper records and failure to file certificates of performance. The Pre-Need Manual developed by the Board is a guide to proper pre-need procedures. Use the manual or call the Board office for assistance.

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CROWN MEMORIAL CASE UPDATE

Earlier this year the NC Court of Appeals overturned the trial court decision to allow Crown Memorial Park to sell caskets pre-need by a unanimous vote of 3-0. Crown has filed notice of appeal to the NC Supreme Court. We are awaiting the Court's decision on whether to hear the appeal.

BOARD ACTION: The Board and Licensee entered into a Consent Order admitting to these violations. Licensee surrendered its pre-need establishment and sales licenses, transfer all pre-need contracts within thirty days of approval of the Consent Order, and suspended Mr. Reese's funeral service license for six months.
